

A guide to vaccination in Northern Ireland - for you and your family

Vaccines prevent the spread of infectious diseases. They save millions of lives every year and are the most successful and cost-effective public health measure in the world after clean water.

In Northern Ireland, the Health and Social Care (HSC) system provides vaccinations free of charge once you are registered with a doctor. There is a routine childhood immunisation programme beginning with babies aged 2 months old. You can ask your family doctor, practice nurse or community pharmacist for more information and how you or your family can catch up on any vaccinations.

If you are pregnant, have an underlying health condition or are aged 50 or over, you may be entitled to a flu vaccine. Children aged 6 months to 17 years with an underlying health condition and all children aged between 2 and 16 are also eligible for a flu vaccine. Contact your family doctor or community pharmacist for more information.
