

The Needle and Syringe Exchange Service is a free, confidential service for people who inject drugs.

It is designed to reduce the spread of blood borne viruses by providing free, sterile injecting equipment and by disposing of used equipment safely.

The leaflet explains how the scheme works and provides contact details for all the participating pharmacies, and the local outreach teams.
